Junior Program for primary school students Senior Program for secondary school students

The 2012 Spring Piano School is for Primary School and Secondary School piano students, ages 6 to 18.

Students attend either the Junior Program for Primary School age students (Tuesday September 25 & Wednesday September 26) or the Senior Program for Secondary School (Thursday September 27 & Friday September 28). The young pianists work intensively to consolidate their musical and pianistic skills, polish their repertoire pieces and also socialise with their musical peers. Students explore the world of the piano in the renovated historic National Trust property *Glenfern*. The *Spring Piano School 2012* is a wonderful school holiday preparation for AMEB, ANZCA, VCE and other examinations, as well as for competitions. It is a valued social and educational opportunity for piano students.

Junior Program for primary school students (and some Year 7 students) Dates and Times

Students should normally have experienced a minimum of 2 years individual piano tuition. Junior Program participants should bring 3 – 5 works prepared to a secure standard. Parents of Year 7 students should contact the Director Robert Chamberlain to determine which program is best for their child.

Betty Vergara-Pink's teaching career began in Germany at the Freiburg Musikhochschule/University of Music, continued at the Kelvin Grove Campus of QUT in Queensland and then continued further with a professorship in piano and piano pedagogy at the Freiburg Musikhochschule in Germany. Betty has performed with orchestra, given solo and chamber music recitals in Australia, Malaysia, Japan, Russia and Germany. In recent years she has followed her first love, piano chamber music. Having retired from the Musikhochschule in Freiburg in 2010, she has recently returned to Australia.

Yoon Sen Lee was born in Singapore and came to Australia in 1991 completing his Bachelor and Master of Music degree with distinction in performance at the University of Western Australia. He also studied performance on fortepiano in Holland with Stanley Hoogland, Bart Van Oort and Geoffrey Lancaster. A highly regarded music educator, his piano students have won prizes in many local and international piano competitions and have also been admitted to into top institutions in USA, such as the New England Conservatory of Music and the Juilliard School of Music. He has been awarded many teaching awards at national and international level including Teacher Certificate of Excellence award – American Association for the Development of the Gifted and Talented - Passion of Music 2009 and also in 2010. He is also the director of the West Australian Pianists' Competition over the past 12 years. As a performer, Yoon Sen performs as pianist and fortepianist and in duo, and with chamber orchestras around Europe, Australia and Asia. He and a few other young musicians recently formed the YSL ensemble, performing concerts regularly in Perth. In 2011, Yoon Sen was awarded the Excellence Award in Promoting Chinese Culture through performance and education in music for the Chinese community.
